





Minister's Message

"O Come let us Adore Him"

Christmas is going to be very different this year, and our usual preparations, activities, services and festivities in the build up to Christmas, will inevitably be somewhat curtailed due to the effects of the pandemic. At the time of writing this piece, it is unknown as to how long the Lockdown will last, and so it is written in the hope that Lockdown will have ended at the beginning of December, allowing some time at least for our usual seasonal preparations.



Whatever our current national circumstances, perhaps the necessity of having to have a more scaled down Advent and Christmas season, will help us to reflect on the simplicity of the first Christmas; for Mary and Joseph were poor and so they made their way to Bethlehem on the most ordinary of animals, that of a simple donkey. There were no fine hotels in which they could stay, just a dirty shed or outbuilding in an inn. There were no hospitals or medical staff around to help as Mary gave birth to her child, just farm animals and the owners of the inn.

We tend to forget the ordinariness of that first Christmas as we put up our decorations and tree, give and receive presents, enjoy special food and wine as we celebrate this most special time of year with those whom we love. Whilst I, like all of you, love the excitement of this season, perhaps we should pause and take time to remember, that God brought his Son and the anticipated Saviour, into the world, amidst poverty, Roman oppression and very challenging times.

However, the birth of that one baby, Jesus Christ, was heralded and welcomed by a choir of heavenly angels telling the world of the wonderful event which had happened. And such was the wonder and mystery of the event, that shepherds left their flocks untended to come and see the new baby, and wise men travelled thousands of miles, bringing gifts to honour someone they knew to be a king. These events were certainly not ordinary, for these people recognised that something amazing had happened, and for this reason alongside Mary, Joseph, the innkeepers and the animals, we have shepherds and kings all gazing in adoration and worshipping this new born baby.

My prayer this December is that we will all, in our own ways, be able to take time to worship and give thanks for the birth of this baby, Jesus Christ, who comes to bring peace and hope into a dark and troubled world. This year, more than ever, we need to share and receive God's offer and gift of love. I hope, therefore, that in the words of that most beautiful hymn, "Come all ye Faithful", we too may be able to come and adore Him this season. I wish you all a very happy Christmas, and let us pray for peace and better times for the year ahead.



The small field next to Church Walk in Bredon is called Glebe Field. We are planning to install various features to improve the biodiversity of this area of land. Following guidance from the Worcestershire Wildlife Trust, we plan to grow wildflowers & fruit trees, build an invertebrate bank and hibernacula, install interpretation boards to educate, a public route through the meadow, with picnic benches to sit, relax and enjoy the environment, and learn about the nature around us.



What I Love About ... Family History Research

My interest in family history began in 1982. My mother's family name was Spetch. I had heard family stories of my great grandfather, a draper in York, disappearing from his home, allegedly with the maid around 1905. Always liked a good mystery. It happened that an evening course on Family History was available in Sanderstead where we lived at that time. I was hooked. The tree grew rapidly. For a while the building of the tree took priority. Spetch was a very unusual surname. It was what is known as a One Name study with the potential that everyone with that surname could be related. But I am still looking to solve the mystery; the circle is smaller but it is not yet resolved!

But in 1986, when I was walking with my father, Benjamin Wells, he uncharacteristically started talking about getting older; he was 70 then. Out of the blue he said, "Before I die, I would like to see my sister again". I had no idea he had a sister. I resolved to find her.

I knew he was born in Penn y Darren in the Rhonda; I knew his mother had died aged 28 from influenza, bronchitis and pneumonia in 1918 at the height of the Spanish Flu pandemic. I knew that he and his older brother Eddie had been sent to live somewhere in Hereford as my grandfather could not cope alone and continue to earn his wage in the coal mines. I knew my grandfather returned to his native Somerset and remarried and returned to the Rhonda, with his new wife, Annie to bring his sons back home and start work again. But Annie hated Wales and eventually the family returned once more to Somerset. I remember Annie was a bit of a tyrant who forbad anyone to talk of Wales. Needless to say, I didn't understand why but, it would explain why I had never heard mention of a sister.

In 1986, family history research was hard work requiring multiple visits to archives and much manual searching. No computers, no ancestry.com. But when you found something it was a joyous occasion. One such moment was finding my father's sister's birth certificate. Her name was Gwladys, the eldest child and just 5 years older than my father. I went to see Uncle Eddie in Somerset. Yes, he did know of a sister Gwladys but had no idea if she was still alive or where she lived. He did tell me that his last home in Wales was in Ynyshir and somewhat casually told me about a distant cousin of sorts called Gordon Wells who played rugby for Wales. I wrote to the Welsh Rugby Union and to a sports journalist in Cardiff who helpfully told me where Gordon lived. We met; he was sure members of the family still lived in Ynyshir but he had no addresses and had never heard of Gwladys. I wrote letters to local newspapers and to pubs seeking their help. I struck gold at the Ynyshir Hotel where the publican had posted a note on his bar asking for information. A customer told him that he had heard that Gwladys was probably now living in Brecon. I wrote to the Dean of Brecon Cathedral. What a gem he was. He put a short article in his Parish magazine. Bingo! Gwladys did live in Brecon and I was put in touch with her daughter who lived in Pontypridd.

Within weeks a reunion was arranged. Along with my father, we travelled to Wales staying first at the Ynyshir Hotel where a previously unknown huge contingent of relations turned up to meet my Dad with all the welcome you would expect from the Welsh Valleys. Next day, we travelled to Brecon to meet Gwladys. It was an emotional reunion but a very happy day. Sadly, Gwladys's health deteriorated and she died in early 1988. My father died suddenly, just two months later.

My husband, Gordon, thought this was a great hobby too. We often worked as a team undertaking research projects for others as a means of raising funds for our chosen charity. Our different approaches and ideas often enabled us to crack difficult problems develop different leads.

We have both found that our hobby opens up a window on related topics: social, local, and political history and Gordon now majors on his local history work. If you like a good detective story, then Family History research may be for you; talking to others, digging deep, following the facts, verifying and sharing ideas. The advent of computer data bases and tools such as ancestry.com have revolutionised the subject presenting many new sources of information and often enabling you to look

at the work of others. But always beware; using other peoples work always needs a check. We have seen many examples where mistakes have been embedded in trees.

This an exciting and rewarding hobby; what's not to love about family history research!?



Microsoft Windows 10 - Feature Update

The latest Feature update (20H2) for Windows 10 has been rolled out. The focus is on bug and performance fixes. Some people are still running very old versions of Windows 10 (have a look at 'Settings' -> 'System' -> 'About' to see the version of windows you are currently on). These updates are not just for aesthetics, they are there to protect your computer from hackers, viruses etc.

Go back to 'Settings' and then 'Update and Security'. If the update is available for your computer, you should see it. If not, it might be because Microsoft thinks your computer isn't capable of installing the update.



They sometimes do not install automatically so going into the 'Update and Security' and checking for updates should be a regular task that you undertake to keep your computer up to date.

Do I need to buy anti-virus (AV) software?

In short "no". Windows 10 comes with a powerful anti-virus product 'Windows Defender'. The number of infected computers I see with Norton, McAfee or other paid-for AV products is testament to this. The free products like AVG and Avast are also pretty much useless. It would be much better to pay for a Microsoft 365 subscription, knowing that your office software will always be up to date than shelling out on AV software.

COVID and the cost of working from home ...

Anyone looking for a new laptop – or even a webcam will probably be aware that their availability and pricing have gone through the roof over the past few months. This trend is not showing any signs of slowing down. So, if you have a laptop but it's getting a bit slow you should consider swapping out your computer's 'spinning disk' hard drive for a solid state disk (SSD) before paying £500+ for a new laptop.

Zoom and Gloom ...

This is my final comment regarding Zoom. Despite warning folk in previous blurbs about the dangers and pitfalls of using Zoom, a lot of people are still using it as their primary social communications tool. I am glad that they are, because I then get to fix their computers and make a tidy profit®

Sylvia Harrington's Recipes for December

NON ALCOHOLIC PUNCH - Serves 20



Ingredients:

4 x 3" cinnamon sticks
6 mace leaves
8 cloves
2 teaspoons grated nutmeg
100 grams granulated sugar
2 x bottles/cartons of red grape juice
Juice and rind of 2 oranges



Method:

 Put everything into a saucepan, bring to a slow boil, turn off heat, lid on and then leave to infuse for at least an hour.

Strain and serve.



CHRISTMAS PUDDING PARFAIT - Serves 12

Ingredients:

Zest and juice of 1 orange
2 tablespoons brandy
100 grams each of sultanas, and
ready to eat prunes
1 teaspoon ground mixed spice
568 ml double cream
100 grams dark muscovado sugar
plus 1 tablespoon extra
4 large eggs separated
A little icing sugar for dusting

Method:

- Line a 4 pint pudding basin with cling film.
- Put zest, juice and brandy, sultanas, prunes and spice in a pan, heat gently for 3-5 minutes until liquid is absorbed.
- Puree in a food processor.
- Whisk cream until just thickened.
- Put sugar and egg yolks in a bowl. Whisk for 5 minutes until creamy and sugar dissolved, fold in cream.
- Wash the whisks thoroughly. Put egg whites in a clean grease free bowl and whisk until soft peaks form.
- Beat in the 1 tablespoon of sugar.
- Stir in a large spoonful of whites into the egg and cream mixture, then fold in the rest with a metal spoon.
- Add the pureed fruit and fold in. Pour mixture into the lined bowl. Freeze for 6 hours.
- To serve, run the bottom of the bowl under a warm tap, turn out onto a serving plate and remove clingfilm.
- Wrap the end of a holly sprig in clingfilm and insert into the parfait to decorate.
- Dust with icing sugar to serve.




