





### Minister's Message

#### 'All You Need is Love'

Many of you will recognise these words as not being from the Bible, but from the title of a well-known Beatles song; and as we enter February, one day which will be in the minds of many will be 14th February, St. Valentine's Day.

St. Valentine was named after St. Valentinus, who was martyred by the Romans for, among other things, secretly conducting Christian marriages; that is why today it is a day for celebrating love, romance and especially married relationships.



The Rev. Paul Hardingham considers what love really means, and in an article asks, "If love is all we need, then what does real love look like?" St. Paul answers this best by describing, in that well known passage from his letter to the church at Corinth, read at many wedding ceremonies, which says "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices in the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails."

The love written of here is unconditional, forgiving and sacrificial; and if we were to take out of this passage the word love, and substitute it with our own name, I wonder if this would be true of each of us. But then if we were to substitute instead of our name, the name of Jesus, how does this passage read then? For this Jesus is available to each one of us, and helps make our love for others grow, bringing true Valentine's joy.

It is also fitting that a few days after St. Valentine's Day, the church commemorates Ash Wednesday, heralding the start of Lent. Although Lent is a season of sadness, as we remember all the sin in the world, especially in our own hearts and minds, it also leads to the greatest display and act of love ever given or undertaken for another, as Jesus offered his life on a cross.

Jesus' love for humanity knew no bounds - He gave His all for us. Therefore, it is right that in February, and throughout the season of Lent, we reflect on what love really means.

Lent this year may be particularly different and difficult to that of previous years; and whatever our position is in this current pandemic as we approach Ash Wednesday, church communities will undoubtedly commemorate Lent in many ways. Whether this will involve giving up some much-loved food, drink or pleasure or by taking something on which will help or bring pleasure to others, people during this season will take the time to reflect on the real meaning of what it is to love.

So, however you choose to mark Lent, let us do it faithfully, honestly and with integrity, giving it our all, and doing everything in the name of love.

To Zoom or not to Zoom? That is the question!

In one of my recent articles, I suggested that there was little enthusiasm amongst Probus Club members for using Zoom for online speakers to present their talks to us remotely. However, despite warnings from computer specialists about the insecurities inherent in using Zoom, it seems to have become the go-to system for online meetings and presentations. As Speaker Secretary, I have had an increasing number of emails from speakers offering to present talks to us on Zoom, most of them telling me how well received they have been, but I have responded with the 'party line' that we have decided not to follow the Zoom route.

But could that all be changing? Now that there are three vaccines available and because Probus members are mostly in their 70's and 80's (with a few in their 90's!), it is very likely that we will all have had the vaccine in a month or two and maybe we are not too far away from resuming our regular face to face Tuesday morning meetings.

But there is a big difference between optimism and reality. At the moment, even the scientists cannot predict when we will get back to normality or even when we resume meetings, what restrictions will still be enforced. Might we still have to be socially distanced, wearing masks? There may be resistance from our members to reintroducing meetings until the Government and the scientists are 100% confident that it is totally safe to get back to normal.

So this (now pessimistic) projection might mean that we may need to try Zoom just to keep our core membership together.



### World Day of Prayer - Friday, 5th March





#### Computer Wisdom by Jim Verrechia, Bredon 'Computer Doctor'

Bearing in mind that most of us are now working from home (and because some kind person has recently hacked into Microsoft, and my account/password was one of millions exposed), I wanted to focus on password security this month. So off we go ...

#### Have I got a Secure Password?

If you think your passwords are secure, then a quick visit to the following website will hopefully make you a little nervous and make you want to do something about it ... https://www.security.org/how-secure-is-my-password/

Forgot your password?

If you start by entering something like 'Bredon1', you will immediately see that it would take a computer just 1 minute to hack this.

- Change it to 'Bredon978' and we're looking at 3 days.
- Now let's get really clever. Change it to 'Br3d0n!\*%&-furtang-ole-biscuit-barrel' and we're looking at 5 sexdecillion years or whatever that is (it's a very long time!).

So the secret is to always use STRONG passwords. But even that won't save you if someone hacks into the site you are using and steals it.

#### Why should I change my passwords regularly?

Well, if we head over to another website, we can see that in 2019 alone there were some pretty serious data breaches, where passwords were exposed, personal data stolen and a host of other things that would make your toenails curl. In fact, one single British security company managed to expose 5 billion records. But don't

take my word for it - see for yourself ... https://selfkey.org/data-breaches-in-2019/

#### Has my password been used by someone else?

If by now you are considering how on earth you are going to get to sleep tonight and have already guzzled a bowl of sleeping tablets, go to another website <a href="https://haveibeenpwned.com/Passwords">https://haveibeenpwned.com/Passwords</a> and see how many times your secret password has been exposed. Oh dear!

#### How can I remember all these passwords?

For several years now there have been tools available to take the stress out of password management. An example of a free tool is 'LastPass'. In its basic form, it does all the things you would need to manage your passwords across all your PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile phones. You go to the www.lastpass.com website and create an account. Then download the LastPass software on each device you want it to manage and it will install an 'extension' for your browser (this is so it can recognise when you need to enter your username and password). Then each time you visit a website where a username and password are needed, it will fill in these details for you. There are other password managers that will do the same job - it is up to you which one you choose.

### 50 Years and Counting .....

Decimalisation took place in the United Kingdom in 1971.

This February (15th) we will celebrate the 50th anniversary of the UK 'going decimal'.


Up to the 14th February 1971, there were 12 pennies to a shilling, and 20 shillings made a pound; so there were 240 pennies to a pound. An ancient system probably introduced by King Offa (757 - 796) around 790 AD.

Having joined Barclays Bank in 1968, I was working at 8/10 Southgate Street, Gloucester. This was an old Martins Bank Branch which was taken over in the wave of bank mergers that took place in the late 1960's.



For a good period before 'D' day, we role played customers and bank staff in rooms set aside with tills containing the 'new fangled' currency and paying in slips etc. with only two columns for pounds and new pence. We used the brand new coins (half, one new penny and two new pennies) which were taking over from the old penny, threepence, and sixpence. The shilling and two shillings (florin) were introduced in 1968 as 5 new pence and 10 new pence respectively, being the same size and weight as the old coins, and therefore were familiar (decimal twins) to staff and customers.







So what was happening on the Bank side of the counter?

Clearly a lot of publicity had gone into the effect of the changeover and included the issue of notices as below. A Decimal Currency Board had been charged with ensuring a smooth transition. All references to the old coinage had to now have the new coinage value shown alongside.

But of course the coinage was not the end of the matter.

The Banks now had to convert over all the bank accounts to reflect decimalisation.

The banks closed for three days during which time the ledger postings in the old currency were finalised. On day one, all the postings (ledger entries) had to be made within set time scales. The branch records were physically driven to London by branch staff under dual control, so only with a minimum of two branch officials. I accompanied the Deputy Manager and seemed to remember it being a very foggy night! During the next day the Head Office Processing Centre then converted all records to the 'new currency'.

All the tills were converted to hold the new different sized coins. At this stage a shilling was 5p, two shillings (a florin) was 10p. In 1982 the half crown was dropped in favour of a new coin which was 20p and a funny shape; the seven sided 50p coin was introduced in 1969 and was being phased in to replace the ten shilling note in 1972. See on the next page, courtesy of the Royal Mint, the value of 50p!

#### 50 Years and Counting .....

Days one and two went so well that by the third day we had little to do and went to the cinema in the afternoon! This was just as well as we were still receiving calls from the public asking what the balances were on their accounts even though we were closed and despite extensive publicity stating figures could not be provided. The following day was a rather busy one!!


Not surprisingly the half penny never really caught on and rounding up became the order of the day. The debate still continues whether such actions contributed to inflation. Certainly high inflation contributed, three years later, to the banking crisis of 1974/75 and inflation was over 20% in the late 1970's. Interestingly the half penny was only withdrawn in December 1984.

For 21 years of my life, I used £, s and d. Would I like to go back to those days?



Well, despite pounds, shillings and pence [Latin: L (librae), s (solidi), d (denarii)] having a long and fascinating history ...... No, thank you, working in tens seems far more logical.



# What I love about ... Girlguiding



My long connection with Guiding had an inauspicious start when I joined the Brownies during the war (the Second World War!!). We met in a loft over a barn and during one riotous game, one of the other Brownies slipped through a crack in the floor! That seemed to be the end of Brownies, but later I joined the Guides. Bearing in mind this was just after the end of the war we did a lot of exciting things, the highlight being a two week camp every summer; once in Northern Ireland and

another time in Holland. I still have a kit list which said I needed my ration book, Identity Card and 2 ounces of sugar! Camping in those days was primitive; only the fortunate girls who had relatives in the Army had sleeping bags; the rest of us had blankets pinned together. Our water supply had to be fetched from the nearest farm by means of buckets and a water chain and stored in dustbins. For the uninitiated, a water chain involved all the Guides

spaced out equally between the tap and the camp site passing the buckets from person to person. This worked very well until the message came down the line that the bins were full. The Guides receiving the message first then disappeared leaving the unfortunate girls at the tap end to carry the remaining buckets all the way! That tested our Guide Law (A guide smiles and sings under all difficulties) to the limit. Toilet facilities were a three foot deep trench which had to be straddled then soil put in to cover the result of your visit!! A terrifying experience for a 10 year old!

When I finished with Guides I donned another uniform for a few years in the Wrens then I restarted my Guiding when we lived in Hong Kong. Later, as we moved to Essex, South Wales, Midlands then Bredon there was always a welcome, and a job, with the local Guiding. I became a trainer for the Guide Association and enjoyed helping other Guiders with the programme. This usually involved a couple of hours in the evening, travelling round the Midlands for a day or occasionally weekends at one of the training centres. You can imagine my amazement when I received a phone call asking if I was free to go to the Caribbean for seven weeks! After freezing 49 little dinners and 49 little puddings for my husband, I was off for this opportunity of a lifetime. I spent a week on each of the islands; British Virgin Islands, St. Kitts, Nevis, Dominica, Anguilla, Montserrat and Grenada. They are all very small islands - and so were the planes that flew us between them!! We were never sure what would greet us at the next stop - sometimes our trainings were held under a tree, on the beach or in a hut with a tin roof during a thunder storm! What I most remember is the incredible friendliness of everyone and the amazing blue of the sea.

What I love most about Guiding is the camping. I have my own little tent with gadgets made from treasured pieces of wood (hazel is best) marked with red insulating tape so that no one else 'acquires' them! My favourite job was QM - i.e. in charge of cooking and always on a wood fire. I am somewhat of an expert with fire lighting and rarely use more than one match. In recent years I have used this skill to burn rubbish in the church yard. (The churchwardens may well remember the occasion I set fire to the compost heap on the day the Archdeacon was doing his annual inspection!) I would watch the Guides struggling to light their fires to cook breakfast and thought how the sight put paid to the notion that 'there's no smoke without fire'!!



Guiding is all about experiences and challenges for the adults and the girls; lying in a field watching a meteorite shower; staying on Pack Holiday even when you are really homesick; cooking for 50 on an open fire in torrential rain; watching seals come into the bay to hear the campfire singing; abseiling for the first time when you are old enough to know better; planting 2,000 snowdrops in Bredon church

yard; trying eggy bread for the first time - and enjoying it! But most of all, finding out that 'A stranger is a friend you have not yet met'!

### Sylvia Harrington's Recipe for February

#### **VEGETABLE CRUMBLE – Serves 4**

#### Ingredients:

(Can be made with most vegetables according to availability)

2 medium onions

2 sticks celery

2 carrots

2 courgettes

1/2 cabbage

1/2 cauliflower

100 grams mushrooms

2 tablespoons sunflower oil

For crumble -

100 grams ground brown or white rice 25 grams ground almonds 50 grams soft margarine or butter salt and pepper 2 teaspoons mixed herbs





#### Method:

- Prepare the vegetables by chopping or slicing and gently sweat them in sunflower oil.
- Place in a greased ovenproof dish.
- In a bowl, mix the ground rice and almonds and rub/ fork in the margarine or butter until like a crumb consistency.
- Season and stir in herbs.
- Place the crumble mixture on top of the vegetables and cook at 400°F (200°C), Gas 6 for 30 minutes until golden brown.
