#### Minister's Message

The beginning of October is likely to see many of our churches featuring some level of Harvest Thanksgiving service, and although in today's society we do not regard Harvest in quite the same way as Agrarian communities of yesteryear would have done, with deep set thankfulness, rejoicing and celebratory meals, it is still a festival in which many communities like to take the opportunity to give thanks to God for all that has been grown, manufactured, farmed and harvested, especially in rural areas such as ours.



Now I love the season of Harvest, and usually in our churches we would be singing special hymns of ploughed fields, scattered seeds and

raising a song of Harvest Home. But not this year! Starting with Wendy James and her Sunday maintenance crew, you may have seen Wendy and her team of volunteers with their fluorescent waistcoats going about their business, keeping our park clean and tidy. So, we mentioned exciting developments within the park. Congratulations to Declan Shields and his subcommittee for the development of what will become a natural wetlands area with dipping pond at the bottom of the playing fields where the bridge is. This has had the added benefit of facilitating the renewal of the pathway, and steps have been introduced so it is now much easier to access the Eckington Road via the small footbridge. Keep an eye on this area as it promises to become an area of fun and natural beauty.

So, on to our exciting news! Drum roll please ...... we can now announce that we have had Parish Council approval to install some brand new play equipment. We will be installing new junior swings for our older age group of children, which will include an Inclusive swing. This is something our Junior Playing Fields Reps at Bredon Hancock's school have been asking about for a very long time and we are thrilled that due to the generosity of our village residents during our fundraising events such as Bredon's Big Day Out and the Santa Sleigh, we are now in a position to proceed. We will also be replacing our worn out orange bowl swing with a brand new one AND even more exciting we are now able to install in both these areas a hardwearing, all weather, rubber mulch surface which means we can remove the current bark surface to create an even safer place to play. You may have noticed we have just installed a brand new hut roof and we have replaced our toddler swing seats. None of this work would have been possible without your generosity and support during our fundraising, so thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

On the subject of fundraising, unfortunately one of our principle fund raisers Bredon's Big Day Out had to be cancelled this year. We know it has been missed by many and thank you for the kind messages we have received. Don't worry, Big Day Out will be back bigger and better in 2021. Our lack of fundraising this year means that our 200 Club fundraiser has become more important to us all than ever. #### **Bredon Outward Bound Association**

For adventures that last a lifetime



It may seem early to be thinking about school holidays next year whilst we are still dealing with the Covid-19 crisis but it is a good time to think about an adventure next summer.

To be eligible for support from the Association you must be a resident of the parish and aged between 11 and 19. You have to be at least 15 to go on a 3 week course. We suggest that for 3 week courses the best time to go is just after GCSE or A Level exams when school finishes early and an adventure is a good way of relaxing after the recent stress.

We had 7 young people booked for courses this last summer but these were cancelled because of Covid-19. However, all 7 are rebooked for courses in 2021. As a result of bookings being carried forward from this year there will be fewer places available next year so it is important to book early. Outward Bound is the original outdoor pursuit organisation established in 1941. The mission of Outward Bound is to "unlock the potential in young people through learning and adventure in the wild". The courses take place in Wales, The Lake District or Scotland. Participants will be involved in many exciting experiences including trekking expeditions, kayaking, sailing, rock climbing, gorge walking and much more. As a result they will learn new skills, practice team working, become more self confident, make new friends and have lots of fun.

An Outward Bound course is an excellent way for preparing for major life changes such as changing schools, going forward to higher education or starting work.

#### What I Love About ... Devon

What is your favourite place in all the world? What makes it so? Did you grow up there with happy memories? Did you go to school there? Did you earn your first wage there? Did you holiday there? Did you meet your wife and get married there? Do you keep going back there and it grows on you every time? What have I missed?

Give me all of the above reasons and I have to conclude that Devon, the land of red earth, sea and moor, cream and swedes

must be the place I love, although I have to say that Bredon, our home for forty seven years of happy memories and many friends, would beat it if I was being strictly honest but then this article would be dead in the water!

If there was a blue plaque marking my birthplace, it would be in the middle of the M5 South carriageway 12 miles from Exeter, as the house where my parents lived was pulled down in the name of progress. I was two when the Second World War started, and like many of my rural contemporaries, we were successfully sheltered by our elders from the horrors of the conflict: yes, we had an air raid shelter: yes, we had evacuees living with us from the worst-hit parts of London: yes, we saw the distant fires from a blitzed Exeter but my memories of it all are scattered. Mrs Lindsay, our neighbour, insisting on cleaning her doorstep despite being told by an exasperated Royal Marine on an exercise that "you're dead": my father's tale of the day their local Home Guard managed to "blow up" their own commander during another exercise: most vividly, standing by the A38 and watching all the vehicles going by, on their way to the ports for D Day. There always seemed to be food on the table, even though we were rationed until well into the 1950s (Some of this courtesy of Billy Burgess, a grocer in a local village, who came every week to take orders, bringing a mysterious brown case, from which he produced "treats" for his loyal customers.)

My schooling was all in Devon. I started at Miss Gauntlet's nursery. From the age of 8, I travelled daily, first by steam train and then by school bus. The independence we were given in those days is staggering: I went alone, walking to and from the stations, cycling to the bus, and in the holidays was allowed freedom to roam. I had friends whose parents owned a farm and spent happy days harvesting, milking, sharing their lives. I even found myself in a main-line signal box, pulling levers to allow the Cornish Riviera Express roar by.

My first wage was earned, at 16, driving the new innovative tractor, the Massey Ferguson "Fergie" with milk churns on the back. I delivered milk every day to all the local houses, pouring the milk out in pint or quart measures into the jugs left on doorsteps. The housewives preferred me to the usual roundsman because they said I gave fuller measures - well, I knew them all! But the farmer was content because they all paid me regularly instead of trying not to - well, they all knew me!



When finally the time came for me to do my duty and undertake National Service, I felt that it would be good to get away from a county that I had only fleetingly left for holidays, say in my father's native Scotland. I, therefore, volunteered for overseas service: this I duly got: they sent me over the border to Somerset.



Yes, I did meet my wife in Devon: yes, we did get married there: yes, we do holiday there every year. However, it was Aristotle who said "Give me a child until he is 7 and I will show you the man." If that is so, is it any wonder I love the county of my childhood so much?


# Book for October ON DEATH

In a culture that does its best to deny death, Timothy Keller - theologian and bestselling author - teaches us about facing death with the resources of faith from the Bible. With wisdom and compassion, Keller finds in the Bible an alternative to both despair or denial. This short, powerful book on Death gives us the tools to understand the meaning of death within God's vision of life.

This vision of the future, which is the glorious hope that God has planned, is shown in the Bible to be founded on the fact of Jesus and his resurrection, and is promised to each of us who have placed our trust in him. Such a hope colours the attitude to death and eases the grieving in all the faithful at times of great loss.

"In order to save us, Jesus became the "PIONEER" of our salvation through suffering and death. The Greek word is **archegos**. Bible scholar William Lane says it really ought to be translated "our champion". A champion was somebody who engaged in representative combat. When David fought Goliath, they both fought as champions for their respective armies. They fought as substitutes. If your champion won, the whole army won the battle, even though none of them lifted a finger.

This is what Jesus did. He took on our greatest enemies -- sin and death. Unlike David, he didn't just risk his life, he gave his life, but in doing so he defeated them. He took the penalty we deserve for our sins -- the punishment of death -- in our place, as our substitute. But because he himself was a man [God-Man] of perfect, sinless love for God and neighbour, death could not hold him (Acts 2:24). He rose from the dead".

Initially it was for production on a Gestetner duplicator when Isabel remembers typing up the 'skins' & having to correct errors by painting over a pink fluid, then replace the 'skin' into the typewriter at exactly the right spot hoping the errors did not show. At that time the Rector, The Rev Leonard Birch was the Editor.



His successor The Rev Colin Beswick who took over, but only for a short time, as his wife became ill. He asked Derrick Grainger to assume the editing job and Derrick did it for nigh on twenty years. During this time the church did purchase an electric typewriter for Isabel to use, but this was still using stencils or 'skins' with all its attendant difficulties.

Derrick handed the editing job over to Sylvia Powell (ably assisted by Roger) for five or six years until about 1998, when Moya Willis took on the mantle. Moya, in turn, passed the job on to Jenny Maslen and then on to Christopher. Assisting each of these editors, Isabel was the reliable cog in the wheel. She would type up the magazine text and take a hard copy to the Editor, later via email. Once Isabel had 'mastered' (!) the use of the Internet and sending emails with attachments. Christopher would send her all the material as it came in and she would return it to him as one document in the required Ariel font size 11 format as he preferred to see a hard copy of all the text.

Christopher has really appreciated Isabel's assistance in this way, as have the many editors before him. Roger Powell informs me that the magazine was FIRST published in January 1912. Amazing to think that Isabel has typed up 42 years worth of those 108!

#### Sylvia Harrington's Recipe for October

#### **ROASTED TOMATO SOUP WITH COURGETTE PESTO - Serves 4**

#### Ingredients:

2 large onions,

- 1.25 kg ripe tomatoes, roughly chopped7 tablespoons olive oil5 fat garlic cloves, peeled a few sprigs of fresh rosemary
- peeled and thinly sliced 1 fennel bulb, thinly sliced 2 tablespoon tomato puree 2 teaspoons caster sugar
- 25 grams toasted pine nuts 50 grams fresh basil leaves 50 grams grated parmesan cheese salt and black pepper

1 small courgette ciabatta (optional)

#### Method:

- Preheat oven 200°C Fan 180°C Gas 6.
- Place chopped tomatoes & 3 tablespoons olive oil, 4 garlic cloves, rosemary, onions & fennel into a roasting tin, toss together & roast for 40-45 mins until vegetables are slightly charred and softened.
- When cool remove the rosemary leaves and stalks.
- Tip the vegetables into a food processor or blender (or use a stick blender in a saucepan). Add the tomato puree & sugar & whizz -- taste -- you may need more sugar if tomatoes are acidic. Add a little water to give a pouring consistency. Transfer into a saucepan and warm through.
- Clean the food processor and whizz the pine nuts, basil leaves (reserve a few for garnish), remaining olive oil & garlic & parmesan cheese to make a pesto.
- Season to taste.
- Grate the courgette and squeeze out excess juice then stir into the pesto.
- Spoon the soup into bowls with a swirl of pesto and reserved basil.
- Alternatively spread the pesto on toasted ciabatta to serve with the soup.




#### **Police Report**
